The Len Everett Scholarship

Len G. Everett was born in Burlington, Iowa, on April 18, 1925 and grew up near Monmouth and Kirkwood, IL. He received his art education from The University of Iowa (BFA - 1950, MFA - 1952). He taught at The University of Iowa, briefly, and studied painting and drawing in New York City at the Art Students League, at the National Academy of Design, and in Provincetown, MA at the Provincetown Art School. Mr. Everett maintained professional art studios in Carnegie Hall and at 41 Union Square in New York City. He taught privately, from his studio, and taught classes at the Kittredge Women's Club. His death in 1984 cut short a career dedicated to the arts and marked by many honors.

The Len Everett Scholarship provides awards for art majors at the graduate or undergraduate level who wish to study or who already are studying studio arts at The University of Iowa. The award is jointly administered by Art Guild of Burlington and The School of Art and Art History at The University of Iowa. The annual selection of the recipient(s) is made by a committee composed of Robert A. McCannon, executor of the Len Everett estate; the director of the School of Art and Art History; the president of the Art Guild of Burlington with the director of the Art Center as an ex-officio member. The scholarships are monetary awards that are applied to a student's tuition. The

selection committee will determine the number of scholarships awarded per year and the amount of each award on an annual basis. The recipients of the scholarships will also be given the opportunity to show their work at the Art Guild of Burlington at an arranged time during the remainder of the year.

Eligibility. The Len Everett Scholarship is restricted to students who are legal residents living within a 100-mile radius of Burlington. In particular, preference is given to those students who performed their undergraduate work in colleges or universities within the stipulated 100-mile radius and who qualify by the above-stated residence requirement, but will not be exclusive of students graduating from high schools in the defined area. A grade point average of 3.0 is required. Past award winners may re-apply each year for the scholarship.

Interview. In order to identify the students who are most deserving of the Len Everett Scholarship, the scholarship committee has an interview and portfolio review with each applicant to discuss their work and educational goals. Interviews will be held at the Art Guild of Burlington **on a Saturday in late March or early April.** You will be notified by letter of your appointment time.

Portfolio. The portfolio should include your outstanding works and current interests. Portfolio contents may include: drawing, painting, photography,

sculpture, ceramics, design, metalsmithing, printmaking, and items such as sketchbooks, art work independent of class assignments and documentation of special art projects and performances.

Transcript, Written Statement, and Letters of Recommendation. Along with the application form, please include your transcript, a one-page written statement about yourself and your artistic work and goals, and two (2) letters of recommendation from individuals who are familiar with your training and ability in art and willing to write a brief recommendation for you.
