Application Instructions

We encourage you to apply well in advance of the session in which you plan to enroll. This application and supporting documents should be in the Office of Admissions at least 10 days prior to the date classes begin.

Your application for admission will be processed as soon as we have received all of your application materials, which include:

- your signed and completed application form, and
- any official transcripts required.

A. Personal Information

A3. Social Security Number (SSN)—We will use your Social Security Number to verify your identity for record-keeping purposes and to help match transcripts and other materials with your admission application. It will not be used as your student ID number. Your Social Security Number will be safeguarded by the University and will not be displayed on official records or made available to others. If you do not have a Social Security Number, leave this item blank.

A7-8. Current/Home Mailing Address—From August 15 through May 15, we will correspond with you at your current address. From May 16 through August 14, your home address will be used. If either address changes, please notify the Office of Admissions.

A15. Requirements for Non-native Speakers of English—Applicants must submit results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Exceptions are made for those whose native language is English or are graduate-level US citizens or graduate-level permanent residents. The University's TOEFL institutional code is 6681.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

Asian: a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

White, not of Hispanic or Latino(a) origin: a person having origin in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or Middle East.

B. Admissions Information

B1. Graduate Credit—Nondepartmental, students seeking graduate credit are advised by the Graduate College.

- A GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale is required for admission. If your undergraduate GPA is below 2.5, you may be considered for admission based on your GRE General Test results or your graduate GPA if you have earned at least 12 semester hours of graduate credit.
- You may register for no more than two courses.
- This status is normally limited to one session of enrollment.
- Credit earned cannot count toward satisfying the residence requirement for a degree.
