Application Information

Students applying to the Colleges of Business or Nursing and international students must apply at www.uiowa.edu/admissions/apply. Students applying to the College of Pharmacy apply through PharmCAS at www.pharmacas.org.

How to Apply

- Submit your completed application by the appropriate deadline.
- Submit the \$40 application fee. Make checks payable to The University of Iowa.
- Have your high school send an official transcript.
- If you've taken college classes, have each college send transcripts of your work.
- Have your ACT or SAT scores sent to us by ACT or the College Board. **Our institution code for ACT is 1356 and for SAT is 6681.** Transfer students with more than 24 semester hours earned do not need to submit test scores.
- Expect to hear from us within five weeks from the date we receive your completed application, fee, transcript(s), and test scores.

Application Deadlines

Apply well before the deadline to allow time to arrange for University housing and to apply for financial aid. The University of Iowa accepts applications up to one year in advance of the session in which you plan to enroll.

Freshman Application Deadlines

Summer session and fall semester—April 1

The priority filing date for the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and for the College of Engineering is Feb. 1. If all application materials are on file Feb. 1, you will be admitted providing you meet our published requirements for guaranteed admission.

Applications received after the priority filing date will be reviewed and admission offered on a space-available basis. All application materials must be postmarked on or before April 1.

Spring semester—Nov. 15

All application materials must be postmarked on or before Nov. 15. There is no priority filing date for spring semester.
