How to Apply

- Submit your completed application by the appropriate deadline.
- Submit the \$40 application fee. Make checks payable to The University of Iowa.
- Have an official transcript sent to us by your high school and each college you've attended.
- Have your ACT or SAT scores sent to us by the testing agency. **Our institution code is 1356 for ACT (6681 for SAT).** Transfer students with more than 24 semester hours earned do not need to submit test scores.
- Expect to hear from us within five weeks from the date we receive your completed application and all supporting materials.

Application Deadlines

Apply well before the deadline to allow time to arrange for University housing and to apply for financial aid. The University of Iowa accepts applications up to one year in advance of the session in which you plan to enroll.
