### Research Mentorship and Collaboration Seminar

Junior faculty and Postdoctoral Fellows who are developing clinical research proposals related to aging are invited to participate in the COA's Seminar for Research Mentorship and Collaboration. The seminar meets twice each month and is intended to help junior researchers advance their projects and related research activities. The seminar offers feedback from experienced clinical investigators in aging-related behavioral research using an informal and flexible format. Goals include facilitating a constructive ongoing dialogue among UI clinical researchers in aging and building grant capacity by promoting collaborations that permit junior faculty, as well as pre and post-doctoral candidates, to initiate projects and apply for independent funding in aging research.

Brief presentations by faculty or trainees may describe current projects, manuscripts, grants, etc., to invite feedback, internal review and mentorship. The actual mentors in attendance may vary from seminar to seminar depending on the content being presented. There will also be brief overviews of grant application procedures, human subjects requirements, recruitment strategies, and other research topics and resources to help address pragmatic issues that often hinder junior researchers.
