We are a non-profit student group composed of a part-time staff that oversees the daily tasks of the council. Our agenda includes sponsoring annual art exhibitions and sales. These events have been a part of University tradition for over 40 years. All funds raised at these events allow the Fine Arts Council to offer yearly student art grants to University of Iowa students involved in fine arts, music, performing arts, literary arts, and film.

Duties of Council Members

- Help advertise events by hanging posters around the campus and in town

- Choose special award winners at art exhibitions
