



2004 SESSION SUMMARY

The 2004 session of the 80th General Assembly ended on April 20th with the passage of the Omnibus Budget Bill (SF 2298). The Governor has 30 days from the end of the session to sign or veto legislation passed by the Legislature. In addition to the Omnibus Budget Bill, there were several other pieces of legislation passed by the General Assembly that have a direct impact on the University of Iowa and the Board of Regents.

**Senate File 2298 – Omnibus Budget Bill** – Awaiting action by the Governor

The bill appropriates the same level of operational funding for the University of Iowa it received in the previous year (Fiscal Year 2004). See table. In addition, the bill contained language authorizing the Board of Regents to issue bonds to renovate our top two capital projects - the Chemistry Building and the Art and Art History Building.

**House File 2418 – Tuition Timing Bill** – Awaiting action by the Governor

Currently, in Iowa Code the Board of Regents is required to set the following year’s tuition rate in November of the previous year. This bill removes the date by which tuition must be set, keeps the requirement that the Board provide written notification of proposed increases in tuition,

fees or charges to the presiding officer of the student government organization and adds a requirement that the meeting at which the Board approves tuition not be held during a holiday or break.

**SF 2174 - Appointment of Student Regent** – Signed by the Governor on April 8, 2004

This law changed statutory language regarding the student member of the Board of Regents. While the student Regent would still be appointed for a six-year term, the law would prohibit the student from serving on the Board for more than one year after the student is no longer enrolled in a Regent university, which rotates among Regent institutions. For future appointments, it would require the

Governor to consult with the student government at the institution from which the proposed student appointee is enrolled prior to appointment.

The 2005 session of the 81st General Assembly will convene on January 10, 2005.
