



IDIS Subscription Information

The *IDIS* database contains indexed bibliographic records, including abstracts from January 1995 forward, and full-text articles related to drugs and drug therapy in humans from over 200 leading medical and pharmaceutical journals. The system is designed to provide immediate access to specific information concerning a drug and/or treatment of a disease state. Authoritative publications have been selected to provide broad coverage of both general and specialty areas of pharmacy and medicine. Formats available include Web and CD-ROM.

SUBSCRIPTIONS: *IDIS* subscriptions are sold on a calendar year basis starting in January. The twelve monthly index updates are cumulative. Article files vary by format.

IDIS/Web: The annual subscription price for the first year is adjusted based on the month the service is activated. The subscription period for subsequent years reverts to a calendar year basis. *IDIS/Web* subscriptions include access to the index from 1966 forward and full text articles from 1988 to the present. In the event that an *IDIS/Web* subscription is not renewed the following year, CD-ROM copies of the Index for that subscription period are available for purchase at a non-current license fee. Additional web access can also be purchased in conjunction with an *IDIS/CD-ROM* Subscription.

IDIS/CD-ROM: The annual subscription price is based on the normal subscription period. *IDIS/CD-ROM* subscriptions include access to the index from 1966 forward and full text articles from 1997 to the present. The index is on two discs (Disc One 1966-1996, Disc Two 1997- current year). Disc One is permanent and should be retained. Disc Two should be destroyed upon receipt of each new monthly update. In the event that an *IDIS/CD-ROM* subscription is not renewed the following year, the subscriber must return, destroy or pay an annual non-current license fee to keep the last CD-ROM Index disc. As an additional service, the complete index (1966 to the present) can also be downloaded from our server.

SYSTEM REQUIREMENTS/EQUIPMENT NEEDS: Data retrieved from the database is intended for distribution solely within the subscriber's organization and may not be accessed in a network without prior written permission from DDIS. The data is not to be transferred, re-transmitted or used with other information for the creation of a combined or consolidated database. Under no circumstances may copies of the data be offered for sale or resale.

IDIS/Web:

- Recommended browsers: Netscape 7.0 or higher, Microsoft Internet Explorer 5.5 or higher, or Firefox 1.0 or higher. JavaScript enabled browser.
- Adobe Acrobat 4.0 or higher
- A printer with 4 MB of memory or higher is recommended.
- Access is via User Identification and Password and/or Internet Protocol (IP) Authentication.

IDIS/CD-ROM:

- IBM 486 or higher PC-compatible computer with at least 16 MB of RAM (Pentium with 32 MB RAM recommended)
- 20 MB of free hard-disk space
- SVGA or VGA Monitor
- Microsoft Windows

IDIS/Microfiche Articles:

- Microfiche are standard (105MM x 148MM) with 98 positive image frames on each at a reduction ratio of 1:24.
- Microfiche readers or reader printers should be equipped with a lens that has a magnification of 24x.
- A bi-modal polarity reader printer that can make positive copies from both positive and negative microfiche is recommended.
- An average year of microfiche (containing approximately 20,000 articles) can be stored in nine linear inches of filing space.

USAGE DEFINITIONS:

IDIS/Web:

- **Single Site Academic Institution:** Single campus; one contiguous geographic location; under a single administration. Campus has a single Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education designation. **Authorized Users:** Faculty (permanent, visiting, emeritus, adjunct), staff, students officially affiliated with the institution, individuals who are located at remote sites or campuses of the subscribing institution who are administered by the subscribing institution and authorized clients of the institution's library.
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- **Multiple Site Academic Institution:** More than one campus or branch campus, each with their own Carnegie designation, and administered independently. Universities or colleges that are part of a State or Regional system, but managed, controlled and administered locally are considered

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IDIS/CD-ROM:

- **Stand-Alone Single Workstation:** For use on one computer (i.e. one CPU) at a single location at one time.
- **LAN:** For use on a local area network (LAN) located in a single physical geographic area within one institution. Priced according to the concurrent number of users accessing the program at any given time.
- **WAN:** For use on a wide area network (WAN). Please contact our office for prices.

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ARTICLE USE: The *IDIS* database provides access to specially chosen journal articles that provide useful data and insight into the use of drugs in human therapy. The *IDIS* indexes (whose primary index fields are the drug name(s) and disease term(s)) are meant to be the only access route to the journal article. Thus the user is directed to only those articles specific for a given therapeutic question. The user reads the articles identified by the search using a VGA monitor or microfiche reader to extract useful data. We believe that many users make copies of pertinent articles needed to answer specific drug information queries as this may provide the most efficient method to evaluate the literature. We would not anticipate that the article copy is permanent and of course it cannot serve to replace the full journal issue. Individual journal articles may be distributed to other health care professionals in the normal provision of drug information. However, we do not support, provide permission or in any way encourage the use of *IDIS* for a free or fee-based document delivery service. The *IDIS* database is published to engender rational drug therapy, improve patient care and encourage the objective evaluation of drug therapy literature among health care professionals.

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
