Honors and Awards

The Academic Advising Center won an award from the National Academic Advising Association for an Introduction to Academics program developed for student orientation.

Nancy Andreasen, the Andrew H. Woods Chair of Psychiatry and director of the UI Mental Health Clinical Research Center, was elected as fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and was inducted into the Association of American Physicians.

Kurt Anstreicher, professor of management sciences, won the Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics Activity Group on Optimization Prize, one of the most distinguished honors in his field.

Christoph Beckermann, UI Foundation Distinguished Professor of Mechanical Engineering, was elected as fellow of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers International.

Marvin Bell, Flannery O'Connor Professor of Letters, was appointed to a second term as Iowa's poet laureate.

Daniel J. Bonthius, assistant professor of pediatrics and neurology, received the Child Neurology Society's young investigator award for his research on congenital lymphocytic choriomeningitis virus infection.

Mary Sue Coleman, UI President until August 2002, was one of 185 scholars and luminaries named fellows of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in recognition of their unique contributions to the nation and the world.

Daniel W. Collins, Henry B. Tippie Research Chair in Accounting, received the 2001 Outstanding Educator Award from the American Accounting Association.

Jeffrey L. Cox, professor of history, was elected as fellow of the Royal Historical Society, a British academic organization.

Ellen Cram, associate director of nursing for Cardiopulmonary and Intensive Care Services at University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, won the 2000-01 Council on Disability Achievement Award. She has provided leadership to the Intensive and Surgical Services Division of the hospital by sharing her philosophy and repeatedly seeking new and unique strategies to enable injured UI employees to return to gainful work in their former positions while recovering.

The Daily Iowan, The University of Iowa's student newspaper, was named one of the top college newspapers in the country for the second year in a row, winning a Pacemaker Award for the 2000-01 academic year.

John Dunkhase, a lecturer in curriculum and instruction, was awarded a distinguished service award from the Iowa Academy of Science's Iowa Science Teachers Section.

E. Peter Greenberg, the Virgil L. and Evalyn N. Shepperd Professor of Molecular Pathogenesis and professor of microbiology, was elected as fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Donald Heistad, the Zahn Professor of Cardiology and director of the Cardiovascular Disease Division in the Department of Internal Medicine, received the prestigious Research Achievement Award from the American Heart Association.

Robert V. Hogg, professor emeritus of statistics and actuarial science, received the second annual Noether Award from the American Statistical Association, honoring a "distinguished senior researcher/teacher in nonparametric statistics."

Forrest M. Holly Jr., professor of civil and environmental engineering and researcher at IHR—Hydroscience & Engineering, was elected to a second consecutive two-year term as president of the International Association of Hydraulic Engineering and Research.

The Iowa Birth Defects Registry, within the College of Public Health, received an "A" grade from the Trust for America's Health advocacy group in recognition of efforts to monitor, research, and uncover possible causes of defects.

Richard E. Kerber, professor of internal medicine and associate director of the Division of Cardiology, was recognized by the American Heart Association with its Scientific Council's distinguished achievement award.

John Kimmich Javier, associate professor of journalism and mass communication, won an award of excellence in the Pictures of the Year International competition sponsored by the University of Missouri School of Journalism. He also won three awards for sports photos in the Iowa Press Photographers Association's professional category, including first place for a sports feature, second place for a pictorial, and honorable mention for a sports action shot.

Charmaine Kleiber, advanced practice nurse at the Children's Hospital of Iowa, University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, was inducted as fellow of the American Academy of Nursing.

Gerhard Loewenberg, professor of political science, won the Frank J. Goodnow Award for distinguished service from the American Political Science Association.

Steven J. Luck, associate professor of psychology, won the Troland Research Award from the National Academy of Sciences in recognition of his "path-breaking behavioral, psychophysical, and physiological studies of attention and visual memory."

Philip Lutgendorf, associate professor in the Department of Asian Languages and Literature, was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship to fund work on his book about the Hindu monkey-god Hanuman.

Susan Lutgendorf, associate professor of psychology, received the American Psychosomatic Society's 2002 early career award for contributions to psychosomatic medicine.

Bob McCown, UI manuscripts librarian, received the Petersen/Harlan Award, which the State Historical Society of Iowa gives to one recipient each year for lifetime achievement in the preservation of Iowa history.

Arthur J. Nowak, professor emeritus of pediatric dentistry and pediatrics, received the Distinguished Service Award from the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD)—the highest honor bestowed by the organization and given only six times in the 54-year history of the AAPD—in recognition of Nowak's work over the past 30 years in building the University's programs in pediatric dentistry and dental public health and for championing the fight for enhanced dental care of young patients with special needs.

Ernest T. Pascarella, professor of educational policy and leadership studies, is coauthor of *How College Affects Students: Findings and Insights from Twenty Years of Research*, one of the "100 most important and influential books about U.S. colleges and universities in the 20th century," according to *100 Classic Books About Higher Education: A Compendium and Essays*.

Michael A. Pfaller, professor of pathology, was recognized by the Institute for Scientific Information as one of the 250 most highly cited researchers in the field of microbiology.

Ignacio Ponseti, professor emeritus of orthopaedic surgery and pioneer of a non-surgical approach to correcting clubfoot, was honored by Mount Sinai NYU Hospital for Joint Diseases with the naming of its Iowa (Ponseti) Center for the Treatment of Clubfoot.

John Rapson, head of the jazz area of the School of Music, won first prize in the large ensembles division of the 2001 Jazz Composers Alliance/Julius Hemphill Composition Awards, for his composition "Riff Bass Bridge Head," recorded with the UI jazz ensemble Johnson County Landmark on its recent CD *Daydreams from the Prairie*. The prize includes a cash award and performance of the work in the upcoming 2002-03 season of the Jazz Composer's Alliance Orchestra.

H. Bradley Sagen, professor emeritus of education, received his third Fulbright grant in nine years to study at Tribhuvan University in Nepal.

Sara Sauers, promotions manager of the University of Iowa Press, received the Carl Hertzog Award for Excellence in Book Design from the Friends of the University Library at the University of Texas at El Paso for her design of Barry Moser's *No Shortcuts: An Essay on Wood Engraving*.

Conrad Schmidt, a senior from Lone Rock, was named the Iowa Press Photographers Association College Photographer of the Year and Iowa Photographer of the Year, marking the first time both awards have gone to the same person. He also was named the association's College Photographer of the Year in 2001.

Debra L. Schutte, assistant professor of nursing, assumed the presidency of the International Society of Nurses in Genetics.

David J. Skorton, the University's vice president for research and external relations, was elected president of the board of the Association for the Accreditation of Human Research Protection Programs, Inc.

The State Health Registry of Iowa, based in the College of Public Health, earned two distinguished honors from the North American Association of Central Cancer Registries.

Richard Sontheimer, professor of dermatology, was inducted into the Association of American Physicians.

Barbara Stay, professor of biological sciences, was selected as fellow of the Entomological Society of America, and received a Fulbright Fellowship and Harvard University's Lalor Foundation Fellowship. Stay also is fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

The Henry B. Tippie College of Business's **M.B.A. program** was ranked fifth in "return on investment" by *Forbes* magazine. The ranking shows that Tippie M.B.A. graduates receive one of the top returns on their educational investment among schools with total costs of less than \$95,000.

The Henry B. Tippie **School of Management** was ranked 49 out of 100 among the top full-time M.B.A. programs in the world by *The Financial Times* of London. The School of Management rose from 57th to 49th place worldwide compared to the ranking last year. It ranked 33rd among U.S. programs, 11th among programs at U.S. public universities, and fifth in the Big 10.

Larry Tobacman, professor of internal medicine, was inducted into the Association of American Physicians.

Rowena Torrevillas, visiting assistant professor of English, is the 2001 winner of the Philippines' National Book Award for personal anthology, in recognition of her recent collection of poetry and prose, *The Sea Gypsies Stay*. This marks the second time in three years that she has received her homeland's national literary award.

The University of Iowa was recognized among the top "schools that support diversity" in a survey of high school guidance counselors published in *Newsweek/Kaplan College Catalog 2002*.

The University of Iowa tied for 20th place among the best public national universities in the country, according to rankings published by *U.S. News & World Report*.

University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics ranked for the 13th time in 13 years by *U.S. News & World Report* as one of the nation's best hospitals, with three honored specialties—otolaryngology (2), ophthalmology (6), and orthopedics (8) making the nation's top 10 this past year.

Two books from the **University of Iowa Press** won national awards. The recent anthology *Like Thunder* won the 2002 Poetry Anthology Award from the Unitarian Universalist Poets Cooperative, and *Reading Inca History*, by Catherine Julien, received the Modern Language Association's Katherine Singer Kovacs Prize.

The **Video Center** received two media awards from the Iowa Motion Picture Association: a first-place award of excellence in the documentary category for the Tom Brokaw-narrated television program *James Van Allen: Flights of Discovery*, and the award of achievement in the new feature or series for TV category for *University Update: The University of Iowa Hygienic Laboratory*.
