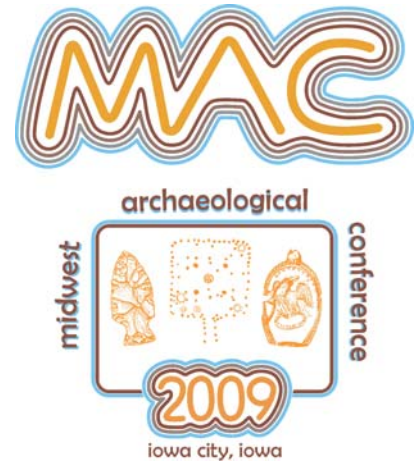


The **2009 MAC Annual Meeting** will be held October 15-18th in Iowa City, Iowa jointly sponsored by the University of Iowa Office of the State Archaeologist (OSA) and Museum of Natural History (MNH). Both OSA and MNH are easy walking distance from the conference hotel. The preliminary schedule of events includes:



- Thursday afternoon/Friday and Saturday mornings and afternoons: papers, symposia, and poster sessions at the conference hotel.
- Thursday evening: reception at the MNH featuring a light buffet and cash bar (pre-registration required) followed by an invited panel discussion open to all conference attendees on an issue of special interest (watch the MAC, Inc. website for details: www.midwestarchaeology.org/).
- Friday morning and afternoon: Group tours (on the hour) of the OSA facility.
- Saturday evening: annual business meeting and award ceremony followed by a cash bar then banquet dinner and speaker (watch the MAC, Inc. website for details) at the conference hotel.
- Sunday: planning for several local archaeological site tour options is in the works, details will be available on the registration forms and MAC, Inc. website.
