

Dec. 4th-William Whittaker: Pre-Historic Earthworks in Iowa

In Iowa there are at least half-dozen earthworks which may be affiliated with the Middle Woodland Adena-Hopewell Complex, these would comprise the western limit of Adena-Hopewell earthworks. Evidence for these earthworks and their cultural affiliation are discussed, including the 2009 surveys of the Poisel Mound Group and the Malchow Mounds State Preserve.

Bill Whittaker, Ph.D., R.P.A., is a project archaeologist at the General Contracts Program at the Office of the State Archaeologist at the University of Iowa. He received his B.A. from the University of Wisconsin, and his M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Iowa. He has published in several journals, including Historical Archaeology, Plains Anthropologist, Geoarchaeology, Midcontinental Journal of Archaeology, Journal of the Iowa Archaeological Society, Archéozoologia, and North American Archaeologist. He is the editor of a book on the frontier forts of Iowa recently published by the University of Iowa Press.
