Earn 3-6 hours credit through Archaeology Fieldwork

Course description

Archaeological field techniques like survey and excavation will be used to explore the prehistory and early history of Black Hawk County. Field research will be carried out at Hartman Reserve Nature Center (Cedar Falls).

Designed for Anthropology majors, teachers, advanced high school students and others interested in archaeology, this workshop first brings you to UNI's Archaeology Lab to learn about the prehistory of the Midwest and laboratory techniques including artifact processing and identification. The majority of the class is spent outdoors learning fundamentals of archaeology, such as map-making, shoveling and troweling, screening, field photography, and record-keeping.

Course requirements

Students should have the ability to participate in moderate physical activities, such as shoveling and hiking with equipment. Students should be prepared to work in a variety of environmental settings and in all types of weather — especially rain and heat.

Course grade will be determined by participation as well as quality of notes and documentation. Graduate students will complete an additional assignment.

Additional opportunities

For those interested, there may be optional field trips to visit other archaeological sites and field schools. Also, as this is actual field research with the possibility of unearthing new sites and artifacts, there may be opportunities to present discoveries to the community and professional archaeological conferences throughout the next year — a great resume builder!
