<sup>2</sup>Non-Campus Building or Property includes student organization property, Lake Okoboji Lakeside Laboratory, Towne Centre in Cedar Rapids, Des Moines Higher Education Collaborative Campus, Tri-State Graduate Center in Sioux City Lake MacBride Field Campus, and the UI Oakdale Campus.

<sup>3</sup>Public Property includes property immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus such as thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities.

<sup>4</sup>Includes Non-Negligent Manslaughter as well as Murder.

<sup>5</sup>Disciplinary Referrals are non-arrest disciplinary complaints initiated against students who committed misconduct that constituted a liquor law, drug, or weapon crime.

\*The arrest figures for 2006 & 2007 have been adjusted consistent with the federal definitions of on-campus property and public property. Some arrests previously counted in one column or another have been moved to the correct column.

**NOTE:** These crime statistics in Table E are derived from crime reports received by the respective law enforcement agencies and administrative departments at the University; they do **not** include privileged counseling information known to the University Counseling Center or the Rape Victim Advocacy Program (R.V.A.P.). RVAP maintains comprehensive statistics on sexual assaults in the greater Iowa City area, including cases where victims have chosen not to report to law enforcement authorities.
