commodore's report Diane Deignan

Hello all! Remember me? This is my second year at the university, in the sailing club, and on the Executive Council, and I'm spending it as Commodore.

As you all know this is the time when the groundhog looks for his shadow, the weather gives us hints of warmth between snowstorms, and the Iowa Sailing Club is busy preparing for another year of sailing—spring is almost here. This also means that it is time for our annual Midwinter meeting, which will be held at the boathouse on Saturday, February 26, with the meeting starting at 1:00 p.m. If there is any way to sum up the year ahead of us, I think it we can say it is a year of change.



First of all, the DNR is planning to do some repairs around Lake Macbride, therefore draining 15 feet from the lake. While the specific dates of this have yet to be confirmed, our latest information says this will not be done this fall.

In addition, we have just submitted a proposal for a new dock and ramp. The request for funds, along with the plans for the new structure were submitted at the end of January, and we expect to hear back on this around the end of March. We would expect the project to be completed this fall. The proposal has been split into two phases, to take place over two years. First, the proposed ramp would be a little lower and longer than our current one, at 31 ft. long by 16 ft. wide. The road to it would be paved and the North embankment would be covered with riprap. All leftover earth would be used to fill in the pond just west of the gravel turn-around area to make room for handicap parking stall(s). The proposed dock, scheduled for the following year, would be a 90 ft. by 16 ft. fixed dock supported by a steel infrastructure and with a ramp, accompanied by two 24 ft. by 14 ft. floating docks, one with a ramp. One floating dock would be at each end, North and South, of the fixed dock. However, please keep in mind these dimensions and dates are not set in stone.

Furthermore, it is an anniversary year for the Bastille Day Regatta, as well as for the club itself. For this reason, a committee named Bastille Day 2000, affectionately termed B-Day 2K, has been established and is led by Greg Lynam. I would like to thank Greg for all the work he is doing to commemorate the 30th year of Bastille Day.

Now, I've held you to this column long enough. I hope to see a record number of members at this year's meeting, February 26, (which just happens to fall on the Commodore's birthday) and until then please feel free to contact me at 319-353-0742 or ddeignan@blue.weeg.uiowa.edu. Although the weather will greatly determine the activities of the day, look forward to good food and fun. Bring skis and skates for sliding, or football and frisbees for all!

3 rear commodore's report

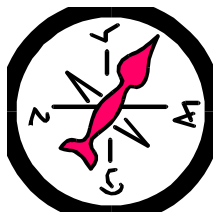

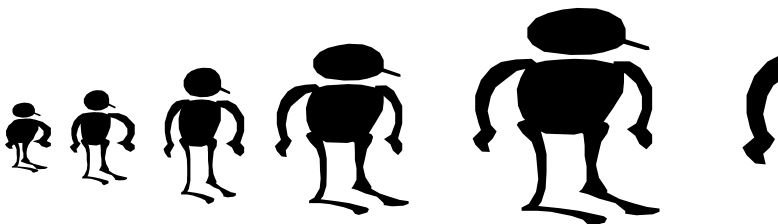

login: *member*

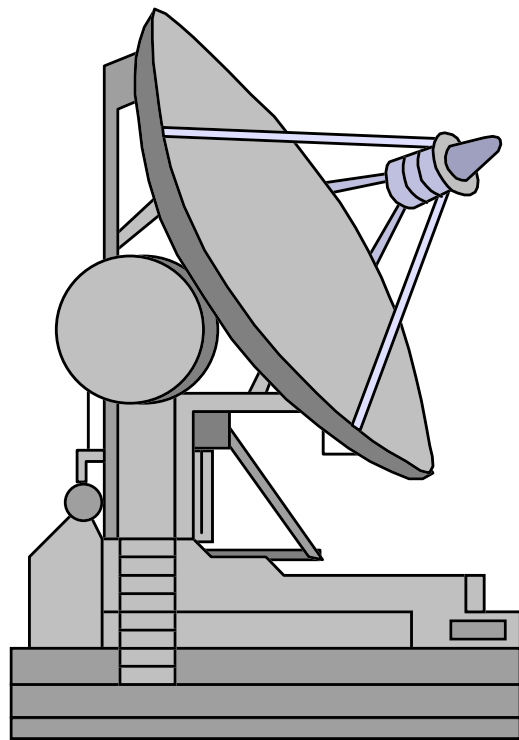
password: *<season>*
