

Minutes from UISC Members Meeting on Wednesday, 3/22/06 in the Purdue Room, Room 341 in the IMU.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. by John Huntley (standing in for absent commodore, Ben Miller-Todd).

- I. The minutes from the last Members Meeting on March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2006 were read by Secretary Amy Rohlfing. Motion (Darling/Legg) to approve minutes without change passes.
  
- II. Officer Reports:
  - A. Erin Wehr-Flowers, Vice-commodore:
    - i. This year's calendar is almost finished.
