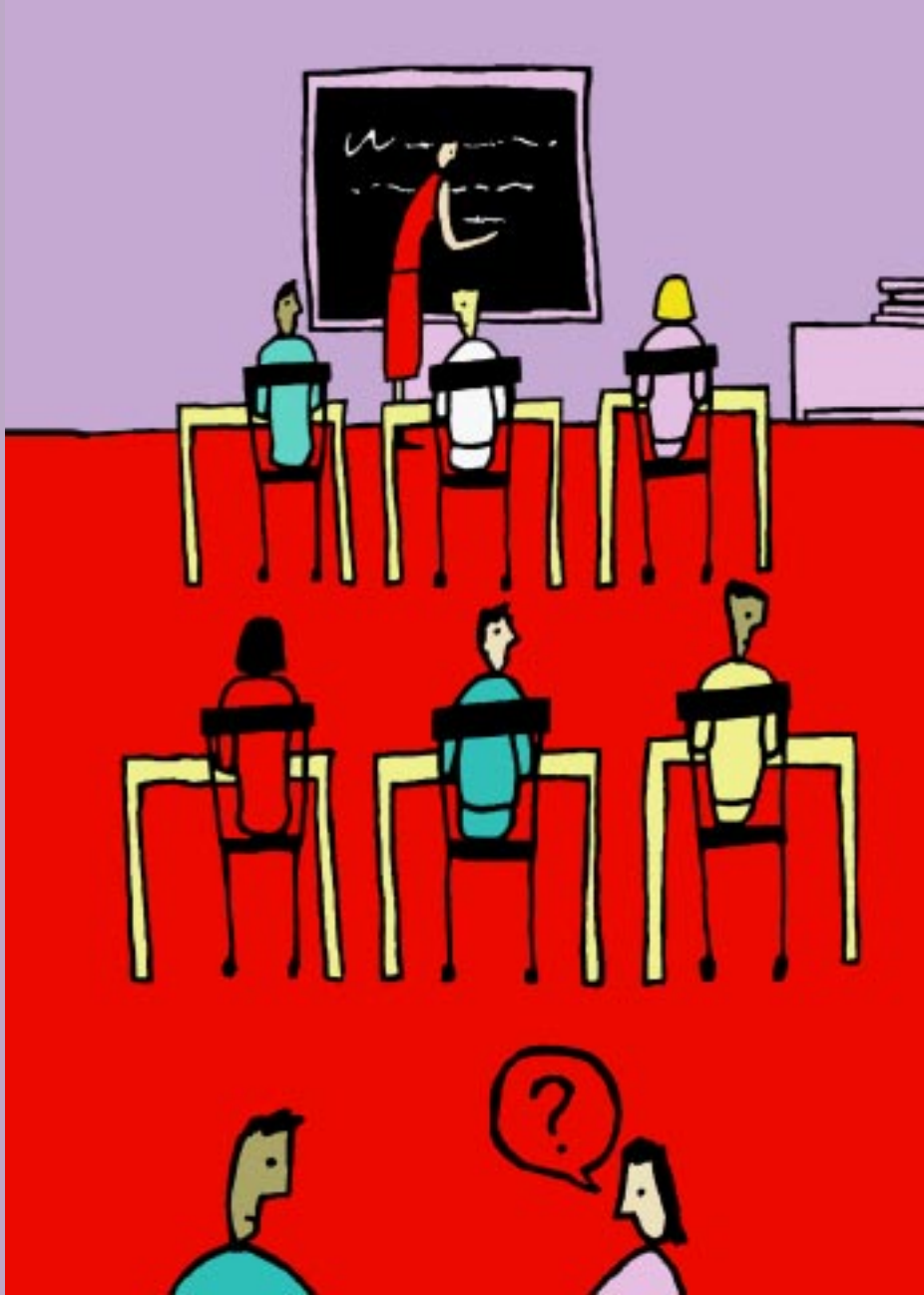


How can a child learn if she can't hear her teacher's voice?
