

What Is WRAC?

One of the first women's centers in the United States, the Women's Resource and Action Center (commonly known as WRAC) was founded as the Women's Center on the University of Iowa campus thirty years ago. Today we offer programs for women and men related to social change issues of all kinds, co-sponsor activities with other campus organizations, and offer support and advocacy for women and girls throughout the region. With more than fifty volunteers, interns, and a permanent staff of four, WRAC is one of the largest women's centers in the Midwest. WRAC's vision is the elimination of all forms of oppression through awareness and social change.

Who Can Volunteer?

Anyone who is enrolled as a student at The University of Iowa or is a member of the greater Iowa City community. 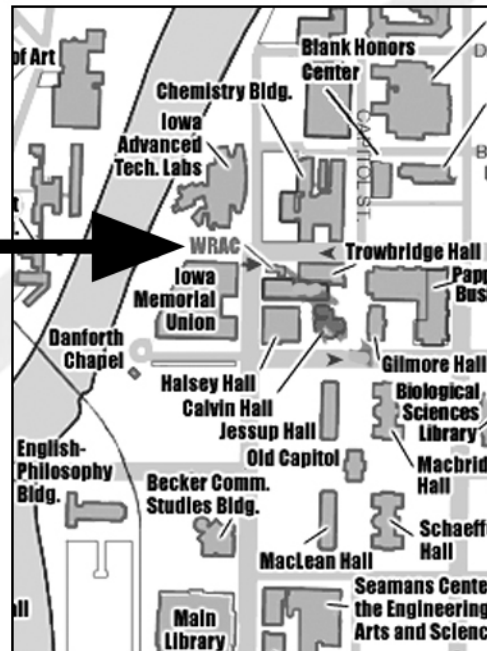

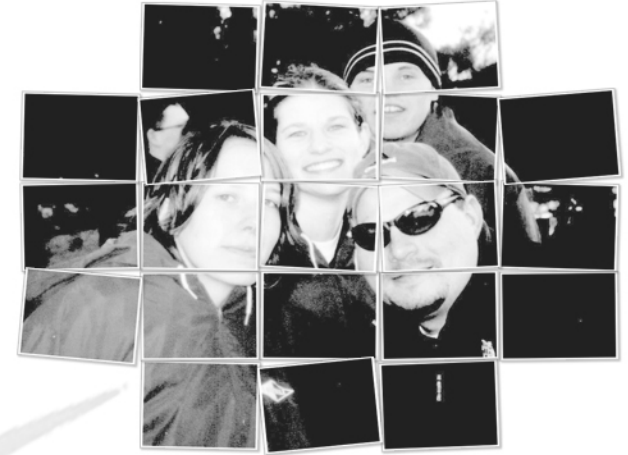
